## When can we say, "All Lives Matter!"

**That statement has not ceased to be true.** Yet in the category of "actions speak louder then words" there is more actions which need to be taken to support "All Lives Matter". By our failures, blacks have the right to say their lives matter too.

'We've come a long way baby' was a slogan celebrating advancements of women's place alongside men. To bad it was used to promote smoking as a sign of equality with men. How we measure equality, is one aspect of the unrest which has boiled up to the surface again. Perhaps more critical is how easily we ignore signs of discrimination in its many forms.

In 1920 the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment granted women the right to vote, there was still a long way to go to live into the desired goal of decades of women's suffrage efforts. The movement had created unrest long before the bill was first introduced and rejected in 1887.

The point is even while racial and gender equality are universally accepted as just humankind can drag our feet. The Majority will claim, "I have no part in that" but what is our part in calling out racism and inequality? Is this a Christian thing to do? Yes, but not with condemnation, rather with truth to set free from fear. Present the truth with Christ-like humility and grace; suffering.

"We are all one body, we have the same Spirit, and we have all been called to the same glorious future. We are called by God to be obedient to build up one another until we come to unity in our faith and knowledge of God's Son, our redeemer. Then we will no longer be like children forever changing our minds about what we believe because someone told us something different. Or because someone has cleverly lied to us and made the lie sound like truth. Instead we will hold to divine truth in Love, becoming more and more like Christ who is the Just judge, each will one day face. Under Christ's direction the whole family of the redeemed fit together perfectly. Each helps the other grow so that together the body of believers is healthy and growing full of love." (paraphrased form Ephesians 4:12-16 NLT)

I get the picture, sin is pervasive, all sin and fall short of the glory of God, yet let each of us, and therefore the church, aspire to Christ-likeness rather than falling in to the fearful attitudes which keep us divided. Otherwise, without Christ as our helper and obedience to the Father's will, we are seduced to imagine tearing it all down will bring something better. What could be better than the blessed life the Creator of all that is calls and aids us to live-into? Difficult as that is.

My initial thought was to say, when we step back and stand in the shadow of the Cross of Christ, then we can say, All Lives Matter. They always have to Jesus Christ and the Father. In the shadow of the Cross all are equal in the salvation Jesus suffered for all people. There is no path, forward or backward which does not require suffering growth. So, though you may fell like tree bark; made tough by external forces and split by vital growth within, both make for a strong and resilient tree.

Who's responsible, who is in positions to establish lasting change? Space here does not allow for more specific discussion, other than it will help all for the church to live out our Christian identity, trusting that God does make a way, and will guide us and help us to live lives now which reveal our eternal salvation, the Power of God's kingdom is mercy and love. Peace is the fruit of faith.

Worship and Music: 1) Pastor Kurt, Barbara Hoover, Steve Richardson and those who have been reading the lessons and helping with the taping sessions were thanked along with Pastor presenting the Daily Devotions. 2) Pastor went to KMA and had our web-page put on their listings page. Christian Education: 1) Sunday School is not being offered at this time. 2) A hold has been placed on the Ecumenical Vacation Bible School. 3) Linda Wolfe has been sending out Children's Bulletins to the Emmanuel and St. Paul's children. Church Property/Parsonage Property: 1) Clean Cut Lawn Care is doing a good job on the parsonage lawn. 2) The Church lawn has lots of dandelions/weeds. Chuck Richardson will contact CCL Care for options. 3) The hedge on the west side of the parsonage needs trimming. 4) The parsonage refrigerator has arrived and installed. 

#### LSI's Host Homes Program

Each year, Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) empowers hundreds of Iowans with disabilities. And despite the COVID-19 pandemic, this year is no different. There is no greater joy for us than seeing an individual develop greater independence, find their confidence, and thrive. And through our innovative Host Homes program, LSI has found a new way to lift up our Iowa neighbors and keep them safe in times of crisis.

Through the program, adults with disabilities (or "mentees") move from a supported community living setting – like a 24-hour, fully staffed home with roommates – and into a private family home with a Host Homes "mentor." LSI collaborates with the individuals we serve and the contracted mentors to ensure each match is the perfect fit and create a shared living opportunity that is beneficial to mentors and mentees. With the extra safety precautions associated with COVID-19, this program is a safe option where participants are in a home setting, interacting with one trusted mentor instead of several staff members.

LSI is seeking compassionate and dedicated caregivers to join us in the mission. If you have room in your heart and in your home, being a Host Homes mentor might be for you! #### We are Still Here: LSI's Services for People with Disabilities

Becky, an LSI Direct Support Professional, supports her client every day through LSI's Services for People with Disabilities. During the COVID-19 crisis, Becky has spent her shifts adding extra safety measures and precautions so she and her client could safely go to the grocery store for food and supplies when the time came.

But her client regularly experiences PTSD, depression, and anxiety, among other mental health conditions, and the isolation and crisis measures around COVID-19 only heightened her experience of these conditions. Becky knew she needed to do something to keep her client feeling comfortable and safe.

During their sessions together, Becky makes sure they practice good hand washing and wear masks. Her client knows she has someone walking alongside her every step of the way, and the client's young daughter found a way to thank Becky for her work: a picture with the words, "I don't like COVID-19, but I'm happy when you come over."

"I can't imagine not seeing my clients through this," Becky says. "We are all in this together."
