Christian patriotism: Dare I say that?

Personally, and standing on my faith in Christ Jesus, I admit that I am uneasy with protestors who believe they need to resort to violence. Even more with elected officials and those who interpret public events for most of the nation who are not challenging that behavior in this great nation. Not a perfect people, much work yet to be done, yet I want to believe in the heartland we continue to make progress addressing racial and economic oppression and inequality.

Let us not reject the principles and systems in place to challenge and correct injustice. Rather hold public leaders accountable to law and principles, as we seek to be, in our personal lives.

Our history of denouncing evil and working to protect the rights and dignity of people throughout the world has revealed the work of God in us and contributed to our national identity. Let us not be Christian in name only; rather those whose lives resemble the grace which we know has saved us; for apart from transformation by God's mercy we ourselves might not be merciful.

I won't speculate whether those who do not denounce violence and property damage think it is a good idea for the nation, will help them in the election, or some combination of those two. I will say, in my mind it dishonors the successes which have been accomplished through appeals to Christian values of dignity and grace, and without resorting to violence and misinformation.

I have concern and am praying for a lot of folks who seem resistant to reevaluating the once popular stance they took with regards to the Black Lives Matters movement (distinct from a gracious insistence that black lives matter I share). Human pride can make one resistant of repenting of error, faith an grace empower people to be peace makers seeking a middle ground and respectful dialogue. In spite of being shouted down by people who insist it is their turn to be heard, we should hear God's command, "Do not be afraid". Romans 12:2 comes to mind:

² Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—His good, pleasing and perfect will. NIV

Which is akin to a parent asking their teenager, "who are you trying to please" or "If Billy (or Sally) jumped off a bridge, would you follow?" Yet scripture appeals to a greater authority than one's own conscious, the author of Romans refers to the creator and loving Father of all humanity who wants His kids to get along and look after one another. Here we have room for improvement, there are many issues in the inner city, and attitudes in rural areas needing gracious enlightenment. Equipped with faith in Jesus we are to be salt and light, even if that makes us a target of those who seek a temporal human way. We are God's eternally.

The call is to not be complacent, rather secure your heart and feet upon God's mercy and let God's reign guide your words and actions. Popularity is not the goal, truth and justice are. "Remember the words I spoke to you", Jesus said, "no servant is greater than their master. If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also." John 15:20 and John 16:33. "I have told you these things so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." tasker Kurt

This Council Meeting was held via Zoom

Present (on line): Jessica Bosley, Kris Sherman, Becky DeWild, Chuck Richardson, Kim Swank, Marilyn Holmes, Mike Koval, Linda Wolfe - Council Secretary, Pastor Kurt Hoover, Deacon Theresa Swank, Absent; Brian Holmes, Dave Wiebold, Call to Order; Council President Jessica Bosley, Secretary's Minutes: The May Council Minutes were e-mailed to each Council Member to review ahead of the meeting. Kim Swank moved to approve the minutes as written; seconded by Marilyn Homes; Council approval. Treasurer's Report: The May Financials were e-mailed to each Council Member to review ahead of the meeting. Discussion: The monthly Offering amount collected vs the monthly Budget amount will be placed in the bulletin. Chuck Richardson moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as printed, seconded by Mike Koval: Council approval. Pastor's Report/Deacons Report: 1) The taped services are going well; Pastor is doing the same service at both churches. 2) The taped devotions are going well; 3) Pastor is participating in Zoom meetings with the Abundant Fields Conference and the Western Iowa Synod on Tuesdays. 3) Pastor is visiting with the congregational members by phone. Jackie Holmes donated the red petunia plants for the front planter. Thanks to Marilyn Holmes and grandchildren Ali Hansen and Andy Hansen for planting the flowers. 4) Several churches around the area are re-opening using recommended guidelines for safety. 5) The Congregational Survey results on re-opening the Church was discussed, 56 surveys were e-mailed and 28 mailed. 15 surveys were returned. Discussion: Was that enough of a response (15 out of 84) to make a decision on the re-opening for in-person worship? They trust the Church Council to make the re-opening decision. Will the taped services continue? Yes. How is St. Paul's doing their services? ½ inside and ½ outside; the congregation can be where they are the most comfortable. More discussion will be held during NEW BUSINESS. COMMITTEES - Worship and Music: No meeting held. Pastor needs members to help with the Power Point; this will be advertized in the bulletin. Christian Education: No Sunday School for the summer months. Ecumenical VBS is cancelled for this year. Church Property/Parsonage Property: 1) The AM transmitter for the outside Worship Services. As the church might re-open, it was tabled for now. 2) Weed control for the Church: Kris Sherman moved for the Church lawn to be put on the clean Cut Lawn Service schedule for a fall application, seconded by Becky DeWild; Council approval. 3) Roof Leak: Nick Rengstorf was contacted to check out the leak. No quote has been received as to the repair as of this meeting. 4) The parsonage hedge needs trimming (belongs to the neighbor). An e-mail will be sent to the Property Committee for dates they are available to trim. 5) The Cole family (east of the back driveway) asked permission to trim the branches of our tree that overhangs their swimming pool at no cost to the Church. Chuck Richardson will contact to the Company. NOTE: The tree was trimmed and shaped. Finance and Stewardship: No report. Membership Committee: No report. LYO/Youth: No report. Altar Guild: Miriam Houchin is stepping away from the Altar Guild duties. Marilyn Holmes is working on a plan to involve more members to serve on a monthly basis. Cookbook: No report. Funeral: No report. Hospitality: No report. Memorial: No report. Wedding: No report. WELCA: The March, April, May and June Bible Studies/Business Meetings were cancelled. The monthly WELCA Financial reports are sent to each member. OLD BUSINESS: 1) The Swift Fiber Optic Company will be contacting the church to check out our present system and where the wiring can come in. NEW BUSINESS: Re-opening the Church: Discussion was held on the pros and cons of offering inperson Worship Services. Council discussion/decisions: Every 3rd pew should be used and the others taped off; Blue painters tape should be used as to not take off the pew finishes; The Pew bibles, Hymnals, pencils and offering will be taken out of the pews and stacked in the Choir Loft (Thanks Jessica Bosley and daughters Maren and Megan for doing this), the pews will be wiped down and vacuumed after each service (Thanks to Byron and Karen Erickson for all the extra work), regular bulletins will be made and placed where the congregation will be seated, an insert with the readings and announcements will be included: Offering envelopes will be available on the Ushers cabinet, the offering plates will be placed at the back of the Church to drop the checks, cash, offering envelopes in; the service will be on the screen including the words to the hymns, enter through the front door and exit out the west and east doors, Communion will be held (Pastor and the Deacons will work on how this is to be done). It was moved by Kris Sherman and seconded by Mike Koval to hold the last Parking Lot Service on June 14 and re-open the church for in-person Worship on June 21 with social distancing and CDC Guidelines; Council approval. Devotions, Adjournment and Closing: Pastor delivered a brief devotional and led the Church Council in The Lord's Prayer. The June 8 Zoom Council Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

Back to School Month

School is right around the corner! This year's back-to-school time feels a little different than usual for all of us, but imagine what it would be like to be a child or teen with an emotional or behavioral disorder. For the last several months, their routine has been turned upside-down and they've learned to adjust to a new way of life. Moving back into a school year structure can be particularly stressful and it can be difficult to concentrate and cope.

Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI) provides mental health services to children and families across the state. It's our job to relate to children who might feel alone or misunderstood. Our therapists provide virtual telehealth therapy sessions with children while our Behavioral Health Intervention Services team collaborates with families virtually or in a community setting to help them develop skills like anger management and healthy decision-making. LSI also provides 24-hour mental health care at the Bremwood and Beloit Residential Treatment Centers in Waverly and Ames to empower lowa's most vulnerable children and teens.

We are Still Here: LSI's Therapy Services

When LSI's workforce began working remote as a COVID-19 precaution, therapist Andrea knew she would need to adjust to a new way of providing therapy to the clients she serves.

In particular, one individual she met with struggled with anxiety on a daily basis. With the pandemic, however, her anxiety deepened and she spiraled to levels she hadn't encountered in years. And she was afraid she would no longer be able to see Andrea and receive the weekly therapy she'd relied on.

But that wasn't stopping Andrea. She set up a home office where she could provide telehealth virtual therapy sessions to all her clients in need of the same consistent care they were used to. Andrea used this time to work with her client on self-care strategies, coping skills, and mindfulness to help her client stay grounded when she felt anxious.

Andrea's client now has the tools she needs to handle the difficult days through this crisis, and Andrea is able to continue providing life-changing serves to Iowa children, adults, and families in her community.

Yes, you heard right. The Emmanuel Lutheran Congregational Summer Project "Collect School Supplies for the Shenandoah School" has been changed.
